


- ☐ In early 2009, the Romanian doctors ranked second among the foreign doctors practising medicine in France
- □ In the two years following the E.U. integration, the number of Romanian doctors entered in the French Order of Doctors increased by 734,2 %
- ☐ It is women who **initiated the migration**
- □ In early 2009, the Romanian women doctors practising medicine in France, having all their official documents in order, represented 70 % of all the female migrants.

The Importance of Labour in the Health System

- The healthcare personnel ensures the population's health a fundamental right, a strong capital and vector of the economic growth
- The training of the healthcare personnel is an expensive process, an investment that must subsequently be employed and protected
- The performances of any health care system are closely related to a good training and distribution of the healthcare personnel
- The doctors are the ones identifying the opportunities of effective use of the expensive ressources: medical investigations, medicine, vaccines, health care instruments and equipments
- We cannot speak about an efficient health care system in the absence of a motivated healthcare personnel



The Socio-Professional Factors


The Departure Country

- Constant aggression on the part of the authorities and of the media


The Host Country

- Better training opportunities for the migrants as well as education and training opportunities for their children


Big Universities – Important Emigration Poles





Doctors' Emigration: a Multiple Tier Loss for Romania





Feminisation of the Migratory Flows














Research Hypotheses


- Growth in the highly qualified migration, especially in that of the Romanian doctors, as a consequence of the acknowledgement of the medical degree obtained in Romania after 2007;
- Increasing feminisation of the migratory flows;

Increase in the highly qualified migration, especially in that of the Romanian doctors, after Romania's integration into E.U.













Sharp Feminisation of the Migratory Flows







The Romanian doctors' migration in France fills the gap of qualified personnel especially in the rural areas and in the small towns experiencing the phenomenon of « medical desertification »











The migratory experience of the Romanian doctors currently practising in Brittany





Consequences of the Migration What Diagnosis regarding Romania?

- The migration of the healthcare personnel leads to major imbalances in the health care system
- The migration increases the shortage of healthcare personnel, thus narrowing the patients' chances to equal treatment
- A health care system with rather low performances that do not respond to the population's health needs, incapable of ensuring the latter's health protection and of providing quality healthcare services
- The migration fills the gap caused by the shortage of health professionals in the host country

Conclusions

The demand for immigration will increase the demand for emigration

 The already existant discrepancies, in terms of the income of the healthcare personnel, will deepen the gap between the countries in Western and Eastern Europe

The negative effects of the emigration of the health care agents will prove to be increasingly severe in the long run.
